



The best viewing times for cranes feeding in fields is prior to 10:00 a.m. and after 2:00 p.m. Some cranes return to roosts during mid-day, and all do before sunset. Cranes are now moving into recently cut corn to feed.

## & Self-Guided Color Tour

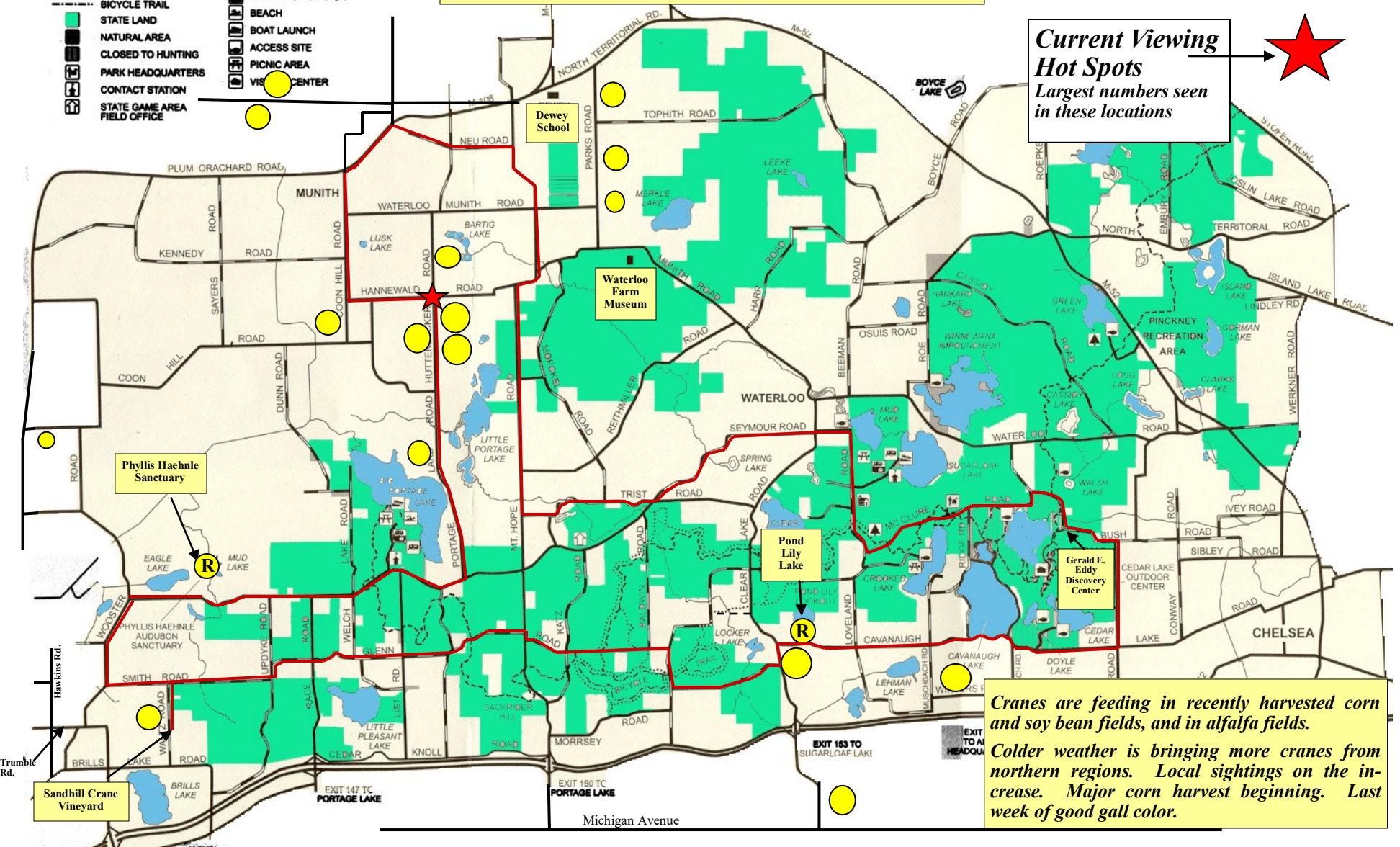
